This is a summary of how Padbury CE school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils’ music education.

Curriculum Music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

At Padbury we follow the Kapow music scheme of work. This Music curriculum has been designed to cover all the skills, knowledge and understanding as set out in the National Curriculum using the Model music Curriculum (March 2021) as guidance. All children in KS1 and KS2 have a whole class music lesson every week. Each lesson is an hour long and is taught by a music specialist.

Early Years also use the Kapow music scheme of work and also sing songs and rhymes regularly, as well as accessing musical instruments in continuous provision.

Music from different time periods and from around the world is evenly balanced throughout the curriculum. Music technology is utilised in our curriculum.

The children in Ks2 have many opportunities to play pitched instruments and this year Lower key stage 2 will have half a term dedicated to learning the recorder and upper KS2 will learn the ukulele.

Lessons take into consideration children with SEND. Accessible materials and support are provided when needed.

Extra-Curricular Music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

XYZ offer peripatetic lessons in guitar, drums and ukulele. These are private lessons that parents pay for.

We have a weekly whole school music assembly. In this assembly we listen to different pieces of music from a variety of composers which enriches our children's learning. We also use this assembly to learn new songs and hymns.

We aim to introduce an after-school club in the form of a small choir where we can learn more complex two part songs or an instrumental group this year (2024-25).

In the past we have taken part in musical events with the other schools within the ODBST. This included a choir festival to celebrate the Queens Platinum Jubilee. We are looking at creating more links with these schools in the future.

Musical Experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

During the school year we have a range of exciting musical experiences planned. Plans for 2024-25 are as follows:

Autumn term:

- Singing at our Harvest Festival at St Mary's church
- Maple and Beech class (EYFS and KS1) singing at Grandparents afternoon – a lovely opportunity for our children to celebrate their grandparents
- Maple and Beech class (EYFS and KS1) Nativity performance where the children tell the Christmas story to the whole school, parents/ Grandparents and an extra performance this year for our Padbury Friendly club (Community group).
- Carol singing at our Christmas service – Nine lessons and Carols to our parents and local community.
- A visit from a Pantomime – children join in with singing and dancing

Spring term:

- Candlemass service for Sycamore class (year 5/6)
- KS2 to take part in the musical extravaganza that is Young Voices are Resorts World Arena, Birmingham
- Oak class (year 3/4) performance
- Maple and Beech class (EYFS and KS1) – Mother’s Day Assembly
- Padbury’s Got Talent – an opportunity for the children to sing, dance, play an instrument
- Easter service

Summer term:

- Maple and Beech (EYFS and KS1) Father’s Day assembly
- Sycamore (year 5/6) end of year production
- End of year Leavers Service at St Mary’s church.

As well as all the above, we plan to reintroduce having individuals playing as we come into assembly and having more live performances in school.

Plans for the future 2024-25

- To run an after-school club – either singing or instrumental
- To develop more links with local groups that could come and give us live performances
- Re-introduce individual/groups of children playing in assembly – Create a register of children who play instruments or sing
- Introduce teaching of recorders and ukulele in KS2
